Does your child participate appropriately in small and large group activities such as: circle time, story time, music, sports lessons, birthday parties?

- · Stays with the group

Does your child attempt new tasks knowing it is okay to make mistakes?

- · Is generally willing to try new tasks such as; exploring a new playground, trying new puzzles or toys.
- · Willing to try tasks presented by an adult, such as, drawing a picture and cutting activities
- Follows directions in listening games, such as, "What time is it Mr. Wolf?"

Does your child initiate and complete age appropriate activities?

· Chooses toys or activities from the shelf and generally plays for 5 to 15 minutes at a time.



- Expose your child to new activities and environments such as, new playgrounds, story time at the library, swimming/skating lessons.
- When possible have your child attend preschool or community drops-ins, such as, Family Place, Strong Start, Sunday School, day camps.
- . Spend time with your child doing crafts: such as colouring, painting, cutting and gluing.
- · Play games which are age and developmentally appropriate.
- . Let your child direct play and follow their lead.
- Join in their imaginary games and explore the world through their eyes, such as, having a tea party, building a large tower, build a fort and pretend to camp.
- · Go to the park and play on a regular basis.
- · Have a family games night.
- Ask your child about their day using open ended questions, e.g. Where did you play? Who did you play with? Who did you talk to?
